ANNUAL ASSESSMENTS By-La

By-Laws Article II:D, 2

"The Assessment is due on January 31st of each year, and if the Assessment is paid by that date, the lot owner is entitled to a \$25.00 discount. The obligation of the Assessment is imposed upon each lot owner and becomes a lien upon the property against which such Assessments are made and recorded in the offices of the Clerks of the County Commissions of Berkeley and Morgan Counties, West Virginia, as stated in Item 2 of the Covenants."

Assessment notices for the next calendar year will be mailed by November 30 of each year to each lot owner at the address on file with SHLOA.

The annual assessment for calendar year 2012 is \$250.00. (\$225.00 if paid by January 31)

BY-LAWS AND COVENANTS

The Board manages the affairs of SHLOA as set forth in the by-laws of the Corporation and the covenants. The covenants are part of your deed. These are legal documents. You should have a copy and become familiar with them.

The Board has approved the use of the ball field by organized youth baseball teams on a pre-approved schedule. The schedule will be posted on the bulletin board. During these times, the field is reserved for that use only.

gatherings at no charge to you.

ELECTRIC USE There is a \$5.00 per day charge for the use of the electric at

the pavilion.

HOURS 7am – 10pm

PARKING Because there is no parking area, park along side the roads

Redbud and Audubon keeping the roads open and with

limited use of the grass at the roads edge.

The lake is available for all Lot Owners in Good Standing for swimming and non-motorized boating.

HOURS The Lake is open for use from 6am to 10pm.

DOCKS/PIERS The main pier and the dock by the beach only are part of

SHLOA Common Facilities. All other docks or piers are owned by lot owners' with lake front property and are not

to be used by any other lot owner or guest without

permission of the owner.

FISHING Fishing from the pier around beyond the beach area is not

permitted while swimmers are present. There is a path along the sides of the lake that can be used by owners and

guests to walk around the lake or for fishing spots.

LAKE PASSES Two Lake Passes will be issued to each lot owner (upon

request). It is the responsibilities of the lot owner to keep track of their lake passes and make their guests aware of

the lake rules.

LAKE SIGN-IN A Lake Attendant is usually on duty during specific hours

from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend. The Lake Attendant will have a sign-in sheet and will ask you to show a lake pass and sign-in. The Lake Attendant

will have a list of all lot owners in Good Standing.

PARKING Angle parking is limited and only allowed on the left hand

side of the parking area before the sand/beach. Overflow parking is allowed in the grassy area on the other side of Audubon Road, PARKING IS NOT PERMITTED

ANYWHERE ALONG SIDE THE FENCE!

PETS Pets are not allowed on the sand at any time. Pets are not

allowed in the swimming area while swimmers are present.

(usually between noon and 6pm)

PORTABLE TOILET There will be a portable toilet along side the road on the hill

above the lake for your use between Memorial Day weekend and Labor Day weekend. PLEASE USE IT!

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TELEPHONE	The payphone at the lake is for making outside calls only (i.e. such as for emergencies). There is limited cell phone service in the lake area

The following are not allowed at any time.

NO	Glass Containers
NO	Drunkenness or Loud Parties
NO	Foul Language
NO	Spitting, urination, or defecation in the lake or woods (use the porta-potty)
NO	Littering Please pick up after yourself
NO	Smoking on sand. Smoking is permitted only in the parking lot or on the main dock. Please use "butt cans" to dispose of your cigarettes.)
NO	Pets on Sand Area/Beach whatsoever! Or on the grass or parking lot between 10AM and 6PM
NO	Motors of any kind on the lake
NO	Nude bathing adults or children
NO	Trespassing or disturbing the peace
NO	Activities harmful to you, environment or the rights of others
NO	Fires of any kind
NO	Illegal substances
NO	Do not feed the ducks
NO	Fireworks of any kind are allowed in the lake area, including docks, beach and parking lot.

ADVERTISING

Soliciting is not allowed in our community. You are welcome to put your advertisement on the bulletin board by the mailboxes at the ball field.

As a lot owner, you are also welcome to place an ad in the quarterly newsletters (space permitting) for a small fee.

ANIMAL NUISANCES

All homeowners should keep their dogs secured, whether on their own property or taking walks in the neighborhood. Berkeley and Morgan Counties do have leash laws and nuisance laws.

Let's also be reasonable. Dogs do bark and get loose and wander from time to time. If you are having a problem with your neighbor's dog, discuss the problem with your neighbor first.

As a last resort or if the animal is aggressive toward you or your children – Call the local County's Animal Control and file a complaint.

ATV'S, BIKES AND MOTORS ON OUR ROADS

"BE CAREFUL OUT THERE"

This is a reminder to all of us to be careful and obey the rules of the roads. Our roads are heavily traveled with more than 180 families living here full-time.

Speed Limit is 20mph.

Our roads and community are not to be used as a dirt bike track.

No wheelies, donuts, spinning, spitting gravel or otherwise damaging the roads. Do not drive on private property. Riding in the State Forest is illegal. This is a State Law. Your ATV or motorbike can be confiscated.

CHILDREN, TRESPASSING & PROPERTY DAMAGE We are responsible for our children's behavior. However, we all know when children are out of sight of a supervising adult, children *may* not always do what they know is right.

FIRE ARMS WITHIN OUR COMMUNITY

There are specific guidelines from the counties and states that govern discharging of firearms. We urge you to keep yourself updated on the regulations. If you witness an action that you believe is in violation you must report it to the proper county sheriff's department or State Police and be prepared to appear in court, as a witness, if such action is required. The Board has no control over this issue.

GARBAGE & TRASH

Trash Pickup services are available in both Morgan and Berkeley Counties. Check the phone book for the names and numbers for trash pickup companies.

Also, the third Wednesday of every month WV residents have access to the dump on Allentown Road – Free. Call 754-9153 for hours and restrictions.

Keep your property clean. Trash and Garbage on your property is offensive to all of us. Trash and Garbage cause rats.

In extreme cases – Call the local county's Health Department and file a complaint.

LOUD NOISE

Occasionally some of us will have loud parties. On these occasions, cut the noise out/down at a reasonable time in the evening.

MAILBOXES AT THE BALL FIELD

If you want your mail delivered to your address in Sleepy Hollow, you must purchase a mailbox at the ball field for a one-time fee of \$70.00. If you sell your property the mailbox conveys to the new owner. The new owner is responsible for having the box re-keyed. The Post Office will do that for a small fee.

911 STREET ADDRESSES

For emergency purposes, the State Police, County Authorities and Fire Department required that you post your street number (also called your 911 address) at the entrance of your driveway in 4" reflected numbers.

PROPERTY LINES/PLATS/TAXES, ETC.

Call the appropriate County office for information.

SHLOA does not have that information.

PUBLIC ACCESS TO SLEEPY CREEK

There are two major public accesses to Sleep Creek that are open to the public. One is at the end of Audubon Road. The other is at the end of Maverick Trail.

Under ideal conditions, these entrances are opened by The Department of Natural Resources and a space is cleared in Sleepy Creek for parking.

However, sometimes these accesses are not properly maintained by DNR and a vehicle cannot drive into the parking area.

If you live at the end of these roads and the accesses are not drivable, please call DNR and report it. Until DNR fixes the problem areas and unless they are blocking your right-of-way, be courteous to the public if they park in the cul-desac. Sleepy Creek is open to all and Sleepy Hollow's roads are open to all as a right-of-way.

THEFT & VANDALISM

Call a Law Enforcement Agency. One of the most negative things that can happen in a community is the destruction or defacing of property. Sleepy Hollow has had its share, and it is incumbent on us all to address it. It has been shown around the country and as detailed in the book "Fixing Broken Windows", that rapidly and effectively attacking the issue is the surefire way to end its occurrence.

Your Board needs you to be pro-active by reporting vandalism directly to the authorities:

SPEEDING

Slow Down – the speed limit is 20 MPH ***Accidents can be costly and deadly***

TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS

Call a Law Enforcement Agency and report the accident. Call 911 if the accident involves an emergency.

The Board does not investigate accidents on our roads. Law Enforcement does. Report an accident to a Board member only if the accident has caused damage to our road/fences and other Sleepy Hollow property.
